## **MASTERY LEARNING**

TM Landry has a mastery learning educational model which is achieved through the Oxford Tutorial System. We are not concerned about regurgitation of information for a letter grade, we want students to focus on the application of information.

Rejecting grades as a meaningful form of assessment at TM Landry College Prep does not mean that we do anything less than constantly strive to draw the best from our students. Asking less of our students than all that they can summon up as writers, mathematicians and computer scientists, historians and linguists, is to depart from the essence of who we are as a school. We do not substitute low expectations in place of grades.

Mastery Learning requires students to achieve a minimum of 90% on a knowledge test or tutorial or presentation as a prerequisite of knowledge before moving forward to learn subsequent information(tutorial).

None of the chapter test or tutorial or presentation scores count towards determining if the student has achieved MASTERY level of the course. Only the FINAL ASSESSMENT counts towards the student’s Mastery of the course.
